SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance accepts a proposal and authorizes payment in the amount of \$11,000 for traffic engineering services to be provided by Pape-Dawson Engineers, Inc., under a previously authorized On-Call Professional Traffic Engineering Services Agreement, in connection with the Railroad Quiet Zone Study of the Union Pacific Railroad Line between Sherman and Essex located in Council District 2.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This project provides for the execution of a Railroad Quiet Zone Study. The proposed scope of work includes: a review of the existing data collection effort by the City; an evaluation of the Quiet Zone Risk Index (QZRI) for the applicable railroad crossings within the limits described above; a quantitative comparison of the QZRI with the Nationwide Significant Risk Threshold (NSRT); where necessary, identifying potential crossing improvements that would reduce the QZRI to an acceptable level; providing cost estimates for these crossing improvements; and preparing a report that summarizes the findings.

This ordinance authorizes compensation to Pape-Dawson Engineers, Inc. in the amount of \$11,000 for traffic engineering services in connection with the performance of this study.

A previously executed Public Works Department Professional Services Agreement for on-call professional traffic engineering services with Pape-Dawson Engineers, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$550,000 was approved by City Council on January 6, 2005, though Ordinance No. 100234. To date no funds have been expended under this Professional Services Agreement.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance is consistent with Council Policy to address citizens concerns surrounding issues at railroad crossings.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is a one-time traffic study expenditure. Funds in the amount of \$11,000 are available from Council District 2 Neighborhood Accessibility and Mobility Program funds and are authorized payable to Pape-Dawson Engineers, Inc.

COORDINATION

This request for ordinance has been coordinated with the Office of Management and Budget and the Finance Department.



Re: Proposed Scope of Services for COSA Railroad Quiet Zone Study – Union Pacific Railroad Line Between Sherman and Essex

Dear Mr. Frieble:

Please accept this proposal for engineering services concerning the above referenced project. Our proposed project scope includes the following tasks: a review of the existing data collection effort by the City; evaluate the Quiet Zone Risk Index (QZRI) for the applicable railroad crossings within the limits described above; provide a quantitative comparison of the QZRI with the Nationwide Significant Risk Threshold (NSRT); if necessary, identify potential crossing improvements that would reduce the QZRI to an acceptable level; approximate the cost of any crossing improvements; and provide a memo to summarize the findings.

A detailed scope of services for this project is listed below.

I. Railroad Quiet Zone Study

\$11,000

We will perform an evaluation of the above referenced project limits based on the requirements of the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) for establishing a Quiet Zone. Existing data collection efforts by the City will be evaluated to determine the extent to which existing data may be deficient. A field evaluation will be performed for the existing crossing locations to verify the field conditions present at each location. We will update inventory of crossing and prepare necessary documents to be forwarded to the FRA. Based on the existing level of protection at each crossing, the FRA's "Quiet Zone Calculator" (located on the FRA web site) will be used to calculate the existing QZRI for the entire length of the project. The QZRI will then be used to compare with the NSRT to determine the extent of Supplemental Safety Measures (SSM's) that may be explored as options in order to bring the QZRI down to an acceptable

level. Alternative Safety Measures (ASM's) are presumed to be less desirable and will not be included in the evaluation unless special circumstances dictate their use. We would look to City staff for direction regarding the acceptability of specific SSM's at each crossing location. The findings will be reviewed with City staff prior to preparing a summary memorandum.

We will prepare planning level opinions of probable construction costs for the SSM's and ASM's as appropriate.

It should be noted that Pape-Dawson will be acting in an administrative role for the City and will not be responsible for applying to the FRA to obtain Quiet Zone approval. No representations have or will be made regarding FRA acceptance of the recommended improvements.

II. Schedule

Assuming we receive notice to proceed by Friday, May 13, 2005, we can provide staff with the summary memorandum by Wednesday, June 15, 2005. This schedule assumes 33 calendar days

THIS PROPOSAL ASSUMES AND/OR EXCLUDES THE FOLLOWING:

- No field instrument surveying is included as part of this proposal.
- ◆ Pape-Dawson Engineers, Inc., will apply Federal Quiet Zone guidelines for this project. Pape-Dawson Engineers, Inc., will not provide an independent evaluation/recommendation as to whether a Quiet Zone is appropriate for this application. Pape-Dawson Engineers, Inc., will provide recommendations for SSM's or ASM's, as appropriate, for each grade crossing or each zone.
- ♦ Additional traffic data may be collected, as required, at the discretion of the engineer.
- City of San Antonio shall make the application for a Quiet Zone, if applicable.
- ♦ City of San Antonio retains all liabilities associated with implementation of a Quiet Zone, should one be implemented as a result of this project.

III. Compensation

Basis of Compensation

Pape-Dawson's compensation for the above services will be a charge for personnel services plus an hourly charge for specialized equipment and computers. A budget of \$11,000 is the estimated cost of Pape-Dawson's current understanding of the services identified

above. This budget figure does not include any Direct Expenses (defined below) nor applicable sales tax on services. This budget figure will not be exceeded without written modification of this Agreement.

Direct Expenses shall include reproduction, travel, long distance telephone calls, express mail, special deliveries and subcontractor expenses directly related to these services. Direct Expenses shall include a 10% markup on cost.

Upon Client's signing of this Proposal, this Proposal and the attached Terms and Conditions become the Agreement between the Client and Pape-Dawson.
