Staff Recommendation:

Approval. The zoning request conforms with the Highlands Community Plan. The plan calls for neighborhood commercial land use. The proposed rezoning does not request a change in the base zoning. Historic Significance is appropriate for neighborhood commercial land use calling for quality urban design, and is supported by plan objectives to enhance the distinctive character of the Highlands neighborhoods through the application of design standards. On November 3, 2004 the Historic Design and Review Commission (HDRC) recommended a finding of historic significance for this property. The building qualifies as a City of San Antonio Landmark according to the following criteria of the Historic and Design Section of the Unified Development Code:

- A. it is a visible reminder of the cultural heritage of the community (35-607(b)(1));
- B. its identification as the work of an architect whose individual work has influenced the development of the community and state (35-607(b)(4));
- C. its embodiment of distinguishing characteristics of an architectural style valuable for the study of a period, type, method of construction, or use of indigenous materials (35-607(b)(5));
 - D. its historical, architectural, or cultural integrity of location, design, materials, and workmanship (35-607(b)(8));
 - E. the building has come to represent a part of San Antonio's cultural heritage for at least twenty-five years (35-

Applicant: City of San Antonio, Historic Preservation Office for Good News Missionary Church

Zoning Request: To Designate Historic Significance.

Ann McGlone, Historic Preservation Officer, stated this church built between 1948 and 1949 designed by Henry J. Steinbomer. She stated it was constructed as the church and education building for the Highland Boulevard Church of Christ. She further stated this structure was presented to the Historic Design and Review Commission on November 3, 2004 and was approved for historic designation. This building qualified as a City of San Antonio Landmark according to the criteria of the Historic and Design Section of the Unified Development Code.

OPPOSE

<u>Camerino Ramirez</u>, 1205 E. Highland Blvd., stated he would like to express his opposition at this time. He stated he would like more information on what the purpose of this request is and how this change would affect the surrounding residential properties.

<u>Rafael Duran</u>, 818 Avant, stated he would also like more information on this case. He is unsure of how this zoning change may affect his property.

Staff stated there were 37 notices mailed out to the surrounding property owners, 0 returned in opposition and 0 returned in favor and no response from Highland Park Neighborhood Association.

Everyone present, for and against having been heard and the results of the written notices having been received, the Chairman declared the public hearing closed.
