#### **SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

This ordinance authorizes payment to K. M. Ng & Associates, Inc., a SBE/DBE/MBE firm, for oncall civil engineering services in connection with two drainage projects in Southside Lions Park in City Council District 3:

Item A: Southside Lions Park Pool Drain Line Relocation Project will authorize payment of \$13,703.00 to K. M. Ng & Associates, Inc. and will authorize \$3,000.00 for engineering contingency fees, \$1,000.00 for bid advertising and printing fees, and \$3,000.00 for mandatory project fees, for a total amount of \$20,703.00 from Community Development Block Grant Funds.

Item B: Southside Lions Park (West) Drainage Improvements Project will authorize payment of \$18,424.00 to K. M. Ng & Associates, Inc. and will authorize \$3,000.00 for engineering contingency fees, \$1,200.00 for bid advertising and printing fees, and \$3,000.00 for mandatory project fees, for a total amount of \$25,624.00 from Community Development Block Grant Funds.

Staff recommends approval of these ordinances.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds have been approved for two drainage improvement projects in Southside Lions Park located in City Council District 3. One project (Item A) will relocate a pool drain line at the Southside Lions Community Center pool from its current connection to a storm sewer to a new connection to an existing sanitary sewer line. The second project (Item B) will design a new swale and storm sewer line in the park on the south side of the community center. San Antonio Water System (SAWS) has agreed to participate in the project and will provide the drainage pipe for construction. Together, these projects will help to alleviate drainage issues in the park and the surrounding neighborhood.

Both of the Southside Lions Park drainage projects will be prepared by K. M. Ng & Associates, Inc. The consultant is one of three on-call professional civil engineering firms selected through Ordinance 97945 on August 7, 2003. K. M. Ng & Associates, Inc. currently has two on-call City civil engineering projects with total consultant fees of \$9,921.00. The firm has three City electrical engineering projects, all selected through a Request for Qualification process.

The design phase for both projects will begin in March 2005 and will be completed in May 2005. Construction is anticipated to occur from September 2005 through December 2005.

#### **POLICY ANALYSIS**

The consultant was chosen in accordance with all of the City's consultant selection procedures and was approved by Ordinance 97945 on August 7, 2003.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

Community Development Block Grant funds were programmed for these drainage projects.

The Pool Drain Line Relocation (Item A) will allocate \$20,703.00 from 30<sup>th</sup> Year CDBG funds to complete the design phase of this project. Engineer fees are \$13,703.00, engineer contingency fees are \$3,000.00, bid advertising and printing expenses are \$1,000.00 and mandatory project fees are \$3,000.00.

The Drainage Improvements Project (Item B) will allocate \$25,624.00 from 30<sup>th</sup> Year CDBG funds to complete the design phase. Engineer fees are \$18,424.00, engineer contingency fees are \$3,000.00, bid advertising and printing expenses are \$1,200.00 and mandatory project fees are \$3,000.00.

#### **COORDINATION**

This action has been coordinated with the Housing and Community Development Department, the Public Works Department/Stormwater Engineering, the Finance Department, the Office of Management and Budget and San Antonio Water System (SAWS).






We propose to complete these services in 60 working days for the lump sum amount of Thirteen Thousand, Seven Hundred Three Dollars (\$13,703.00).
