SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance authorizes payment in the amount of \$47,700.00, from the Street Maintenance Operating fund, for Engineering Consulting Services to be provided by Bain Medina Bain, Inc, under a previously authorized Indefinite Delivery Professional Services Agreement for engineering consulting services in connection with design adjustments at several railroad crossings in Council Districts 1, 5 and 8.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Public Works Department released a solicitation for Indefinite Delivery Engineering Services to include professional program management, design, and construction administration services in connection with sidewalk and street improvement projects that are similar in nature and located City-wide. These projects may include the construction or reconstruction of sidewalks, ADA improvements, neighborhood traffic calming, drainage, streets, and other infrastructure improvements.

Ordinance No. 99636 approved on September 2, 2004 selected Bain Medina Bain, Inc. as one of the two firms to provide Indefinite Delivery Engineering Services, in an amount not to exceed \$400,000, and will be utilized to provide professional surveying and engineering services for needed adjustments and road improvements at various railroad crossings which are experiencing deterioration caused by automobiles and heavy traffic. Union Pacific Railroad Company (UPRR) will be reinforcing numerous rail crossings throughout San Antonio utilizing concrete planks. This work will change the elevation of these crossings; therefore, the City will need to make roadway adjustments to compensate for a smooth transition. UPRR is only responsible for the work within their crossing and it is the City's responsibility for completing any improvements needed as a result of this work on the City's right of way.

Bain Medina Bain will survey, provide engineering, and develop a traffic control plan for each of the following crossings:

As of February 18, 2005, no funds have been expended for services provided under this Professional Services Agreement.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be consistent with City Council policy to ensure public safety.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure and not included in the FY 05-10 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$47,700.00 are available from the Street Maintenance Operating fund to be authorized payable to Bain Medina Bain, Inc.

COORDINATION

This request for ordinance has been coordinated with the Office of Management and Budget and the Finance Department.

Bain Medina Bain, Inc. (BMB) is pleased to submit this proposal to provide professional surveying and engineering services for assisting in designing adjustments to the roads at various UPRR crossings. BMB proposes to survey, provide engineering and a traffic control plan for each crossing selected for engineering assistance.

BMB proposes the following services:

- Meet with CSA to review project and visit each crossing.
- 2. Set local control.
- 3. Survey key features of each site including railroad tracks, privament, curbs, drainage, etc.
- Obtain any existing information of each site such as block if aps, aerial photos, utilities, construction drawings, etc.
- Prepare a base drawing showing existing information and survey information with a roadway profile.
- Calculate any hydrologic or hydraulic calculations if necessary.
- Set a proposed roadway profile based on a adjusted railroad grade or proposed railroad grade.
- 8. Show proposed roadway improvements on a plan view.
- 9. Show proposed drainage improvements if necessary.
- 10. Submit to CSA for review and comment.
- 11. Meet with CSA to discuss comments.
- 12. Revise per comments and resubmit.

BMB's fee will be hourly plus cost and will be based on the agreed to hourly rates for the Citywide Sidewalk and Street Improvements Project. BMB estimates that the fee will not exceed \$47,700.00.
