SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance authorizes the Interim City Manager to accept and execute a contract change granting an additional \$286,541.00 from the Texas Department of State Health Services (TDSHS) to augment support for the Inner-City School Immunization Program in the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District (SAMHD) and extend the budget period through August 31, 2005. The ordinance also revises the program budget and amends the personnel complement.

Staff recommends approval.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The City Manager was authorized to execute the Public Health State Support Project 2004/2005 contract with TDSHS through an ordinance passed and approved on December 4, 2003 providing annual assistance to the City in support of the core public health activities provided by the SAMHD. TDSHS has now offered a contract change totaling \$286,541.00 through Contract Change Notice No. 21, Attachment 04C, to augment support for the ongoing Local Public Health Support Program in the SAMHD and extend the budget period from January 1, 2004 through August 31, 2005 (See Attachment II).

One of the SAMHD core public health activities in the Local Public Health Support Program is the Inner-City School Immunization Program. This program works to eliminate barriers, expand immunization delivery, and establish consistent policies to immunize pre-school age children. The goal of the program is to prevent, control, and eliminate indigenous vaccine-preventable diseases by providing immunizations and applying epidemiological principles and outbreak control measures in San Antonio and Bexar County.

The personnel complement, previously eleven (11) positions, will be revised to twelve (12) positions (See Attachment I). The addition of a Health Program Supervisor position will promote better planning and coordination of program activities.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Thirteen thousand (13,000) children are directly impacted by three (3) SAMHD immunization clinics located within the targeted nine zip codes: 78201, 78207, 78210, 78211, 78223, 78227, 78228, 78237,

and 78242. Money from this activity supports these clinics in service delivery and salaries of individuals in the clinics.

Acceptance of this contract change from TDSHS will continue the long-standing practice of utilizing Federal and State aid to support the local public health programs of the City.

FISCAL IMPACT

This TDSHS contract change provides an additional \$286,541.00 in funding to augment the Inner-City School Immunization Program in the SAMHD and extend the program through August 31, 2005. This contract change brings total TDSHS support for this program to \$716,353.00. In addition, co-payments from patients receiving services from the Inner-City School Immunization Program will add an estimated \$40,000.00 in program revenues.

Acceptance of this contract change will place no demand on the City General Fund.

COORDINATION

The City Attorney's Office and the Human Resources Department, Risk Management Division have reviewed the contract with TDSHS.

SUPPLEMENTARY COMMENTS

Provisions of the Ethics Ordinance do not apply.

AN ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF AN ADDITIONAL \$286,541.00 FROM THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF STATE HEALTH SERVICES (TDSHS) TO AUGMENT SUPPORT FOR THE ONGOING INNER-CITY SCHOOL IMMUNIZATION PROGRAM IN THE SAN ANTONIO METROPOLITAN HEALTH DISTRICT AND EXTEND THE GRANT PERIOD THROUGH AUGUST 31, 2005; APPROVING THE EXECUTION OF A CHANGE TO THE CONTRACT WITH TDSHS; REVISING THE PROGRAM BUDGET; AND AMENDING THE PERSONNEL COMPLEMENT.

WHEREAS, the Texas Department of Health (TDH) provides annual financial assistance to the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District (SAMHD) to supplement the delivery of various comprehensive public health services to protect the health of all residents within the jurisdiction of the SAMHD; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 98536, passed and approved on December 4, 2003, authorized the execution of Contract 7460020708 2005 between the City of San Antonio and TDSHS, covering operation of the Public Health State Support Project 2004/2005 in the SAMHD; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 98736, passed and approved on January 29, 2004, authorized the acceptance of \$214,955.00 from TDSHS through Contract Change Notice No. 03, Attachment No. 04 to the above contract to fund the ongoing Inner-City School Immunization Program in the SAMHD for the period January 1. 2004 through December 31, 2004; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 99414, passed and approved on June 24, 2004, authorized the acceptance of an additional \$71,586.00 from TDSHS through Contract Change Notice No. 07, Attachment No. 04A to the above contract to augment support for said program; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 100099, passed and approved on December 9, 2004, authorized the acceptance of TDSHS Contract Change Notice No. 15, Attachment No. 04B to the above contract, providing an additional \$143,271.00 to augment support for the Program; and

WHEREAS, TDSHS has now offered Contract Change Notice No. 21, Attachment No. 04C to extend the budget period from December 31, 2004 through August 31, 2005 and provide an additional \$286,541.00 to augment the extended program coverage; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary to authorize the acceptance of the additional contract support from TDSHS, approve the execution of the contract change notice, revise the program budget and amend the personnel complement; **NOW THEREFORE**:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

- **SECTION 1.** The Interim City Manager, or his designee, is authorized to accept an additional \$286,541.00 from TDSHS to augment support for the Inner-City School Immunization Program in the SAMHD and extend the budget period through August 31, 2005. The Interim City Manager, or his designee, is further authorized to execute Contract Change Notice No. 21, Attachment No. 04C to Grant Contract 7460020708 2005 with TDSHS. A copy of Contract Change Notice No. 21 is set out in Attachment II and incorporated herein for all purposes.
- **SECTION 2.** SAP Fund No. 26016000, Funds Center 3607300000, Cost Center 3607300001, Internal Order 136000000150, is hereby designated for use in accounting for the fiscal transactions of this program.
- **SECTION 3.** The additional sum of \$286,541.00 is hereby appropriated in the above-designated, and the budget set out in Attachment I is approved and adopted for entry on the City books.
- **SECTION 4.** Co-payments obtained from patients receiving services through Inner-City School Immunization Program will be deposited into SAP Fund 26016000, Funds Center 3607300000, Cost Center 3607300001, Internal Order No. 136000000150, SAP GL Account No. 4502230.
- **SECTION 5.** The previous eleven (11) personnel positions are hereby increased by one (1) to twelve (12) as set out in Attachment I and are hereby authorized for Cost Center 3607300001, Internal Order No. 136000000150.
- **SECTION 6.** The Director of Finance may, subject to concurrence by the Interim City Manager or the Interim City Manager's designee, correct allocation to specific fund numbers, account numbers, and internal order numbers as necessary to carry out the purpose of this ordinance.
- **SECTION 7.** Should the grant awarded be in an amount other than that budgeted for, or should the grant contain terms and conditions different than those currently existing, acceptance of the grant, budget and corresponding personnel complement will be subject to subsequent City Council ordinance.

SECTION 8. This ordinance shall be	be effective on and after the tenth day after passage hereof.

It is mutually agreed by and between the contracting parties to amend the conditions of Document No. 7460020708 2005 -04B as written below. All other conditions not hereby amended are to remain in full force and effect.

SECTION I. SCOPE OF WORK, 2nd paragraph, is replaced with the following:

PERFORMING AGENCY will provide essential public health services as specified in PERFORMING AGENCY'S approved 2004 Interlocal Application for Immunization Services, dated June 16, 2003, and subsequent renewal applications, incorporated herein and made part of this contract Attachment. Any revisions to these documents shall be approved by RECEIVING AGENCY Program and transmitted in writing to PERFORMING AGENCY.

SECTION I. SCOPE OF WORK, 8th paragraph, is replaced with the following:

PERFORMING AGENCY shall ensure a health care workforce that is knowledgeable about vaccines, vaccine safety, vaccine-preventable diseases, and delivery of immunization services.

SECTION I. SCOPE OF WORK, 16th paragraph, is replaced with the following:

PERFORMING AGENCY shall provide to RECEIVING AGENCY Program periodic data transfers of all vaccines administered in a format that is compatible for inclusion in the statewide immunization registry, ImmTrac, and in accordance with the schedule provided by RECEIVING AGENCY.

SECTION I. SCOPE OF WORK, 17th paragraph, bullets 1, 10, and 14, are replaced with the following:

- PERFORMING AGENCY'S approved 2004 Interlocal Application for Immunization Services, and any revisions or subsequent renewal applications;
- RECEIVING AGENCY'S Standards for Public Health Clinic Services, revised August 31, 2004;
- Standards for Child and Adolescent Immunization Practices, February 8, 2002, recommended by the National Vaccine Advisory Committee, approved by the

United States Public Health Service, and endorsed by the American Academy of Pediatrics.

SECTION I. PERFORMANCE MEASURES, is replaced in its entirety with the following:

All activities shall be performed in accordance with PERFORMING AGENCY'S Annual Plan and detailed budget as approved by RECEIVING AGENCY Program based on the *Interlocal Application for Immunization Services*, dated June 16, 2003 and any subsequent renewal applications. The following performance measure(s) will be used, in part, to assess PERFORMING AGENCY'S effectiveness in providing the services described in this contract Attachment to the service area, without waiving the enforceability of any of the terms of the contract Attachment.

PERFORMING AGENCY shall submit to RECEIVING AGENCY Program the monthly reports of doses administered and the monthly biological order form in a format provided by RECEIVING AGENCY and in accordance with the schedule provided to PERFORMING AGENCY by RECEIVING AGENCY Program.

PERFORMING AGENCY shall implement an immunization reminder and recall system to notify parents or guardians of children less than 36 months of age when immunizations are due or past due. The notifications may be automated or manual and may consist of mail or telephone contacts.

PERFORMING AGENCY shall complete 100% of annual assessments in sub-contracted entities and local Women, Infant and Children (WIC) clinics using the Assessment, Feedback, Incentives, and eXchange (AFIX) methodology as assigned by RECEIVING AGENCY. PERFORMING AGENCY shall submit assessment results to RECEIVING AGENCY Program within two (2) weeks after completion.

PERFORMING AGENCY shall recruit and enroll providers into the Texas Vaccines for Children (TVFC) program.

PERFORMING AGENCY will perform the following applicable required activities:

- 1. Implement a plan to improve vaccination coverage levels;
- 2. Work with the local WIC agencies for referral of under-vaccinated WIC enrollees;
- 3. Ensure that expired, wasted, and unaccounted for vaccines do not exceed 5% for DTaP, Hib, hepatitis B, IPV, MMR, PCV7, and varicella vaccines;
- 4. Decrease the proportion of duplicate records or questionable matches in ImmTrac;
- 5. Increase the percentage of children less than six (6) years of age participating in ImmTrac;
- 6. Increase the number of registered provider sites for ImmTrac;
- 7. Increase TVFC provider enrollment;
- 8. Increase the number of educational opportunities on vaccine-preventable diseases available to public and private providers;

- 9. Complete 100% of assigned TVFC follow-up site visits;
- 10. Promote and ensure immunization services are provided for all age groups with emphasis on pockets of need;
- 11. Increase the reporting of varicella cases;
- 12. Complete 90% of vaccine-preventable disease investigations within thirty (30) days from date reported;
- 13. Identify all infants born to hepatitis B surface antigen (HBsAG)-positive pregnant women. PERFORMING AGENCY shall investigate 100% of suspected hepatitis B infections in pregnant women to ensure appropriate treatment and follow-up as directed by Health and Safety Code §81.090 and RECEIVING AGENCY'S Vaccine-Preventable Disease Surveillance Guidelines;
- 14. Ensure all reported infants born to HBsAg positive women receive hepatitis B vaccine and Hepatitis B Immune Globulin (HBIG) within seven (7) days of birth;
- 15. Complete 100% of assigned childcare facility assessments or surveys; and,
- 16. Complete 100% of assigned private school assessments or surveys.

Activities may be subsequently amended as directed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and RECEIVING AGENCY Program. RECEIVING AGENCY Program must approve, in writing, any revisions to the PERFORMING AGENCY'S Annual Plan.

SECTION II. SPECIAL PROVISIONS, 2nd, 3rd, and 5th paragraphs are replaced with the following:

Funds shall not be used for purchase of vaccines, inpatient care, construction of facilities, or debt retirement in accordance with RECEIVING AGENCY *Interlocal Application for Immunization Services*, dated June 16, 2003 and any subsequent renewal applications.

Travel expenses shall be reimbursed according to current state travel regulations and shall not exceed the reimbursement for mileage allowed under the Appropriations Act.

PERFORMING AGENCY is required to complete and submit the following reports utilizing a format provided by RECEIVING AGENCY Program:
