SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance authorizes payment in the amount of \$10,300.00 to Vickrey and Associates, Inc. (SBE/DBE/MBE) for civil engineering services under an existing professional services contract in connection with the Gateway Terrace Park Development Project in City Council District 4; authorizes \$8,100.00 for topographical fees and \$1,250.00 for environmental investigation fees for a total amount of \$19,650.00 from 1999-2003 Park Bond funds; appropriates funds; and provides for payment.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This ordinance will hire an engineering firm to design basic park improvements to the Gateway Terrace Park, located at Knollcrest and Merry Oaks in City Council District 4. Bexar County transferred the property of 5.747 acres to the City in 2004. It currently consists of a large drainage pit, which requires work to develop it into usable park space. Funds of \$250,000.00 were approved in the 1999 Park Bond Issue for this project. The scope of work will include civil engineering services including a topographic survey, drainage impact study, and grading plan. Concurrently, staff will design plans for a walking trail with associated lighting. A previous ordinance approved funds for land acquisition fees.

The firm of Vickrey and Associates, a SBE/DBE/MBE firm, has been selected to provide the engineering work for the Gateway Terrace Park Development Project. The consultant is one of three on-call professional engineering firms selected through Ordinance 97945 on August 7, 2003. This is the third project assigned to Vickrey & Associates, Inc. under the on-call contract with two prior contracts totaling \$57,500.00. The project is scheduled to begin in October 2005 and to be completed in November 2005.

POLICY ANALYSIS

This action is consistent with the approved 1999 Park Bond Issue that designated funds for this project. The consultant was chosen in accordance with the City's consultant selection procedures and approved by Ordinance 97945 on August 7, 2003.

FISCAL IMPACT

Funds of \$250,000.00 in 1999-2003 Park Bond funds were approved for the Gateway Terrace Park Development Project. A total of \$3,900.00 was previously encumbered for land acquisition fees. The proposed ordinance will allocate additional funds of \$19,650.00. The project will utilize \$10,300.00 for engineering fees, \$8,100.00 for topographical fees, and \$1,250.00 for environmental investigation fees. The General Fund budget is not impacted.

COORDINATION

The Public Works Department, Finance Department, and the Office of Management and Budget have assisted with this action.


