SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

An Ordinance, approving reprogramming \$1,718,532.45 of CDBG funds from completed or discontinued projects and \$1,297,965.59 from CDBG program income for a total of \$3,016,498.04 of CDBG funds and \$1,467,965.47 from HOME projects and HOME Program Income to projects that can begin within 60 days of contract award from the city and, authorizing the City Manager, the Assistant City Managers and the Housing and Community Development Director to execute documents necessary to implement the projects approved as part of this action and authorizing the Finance Director to establish accounts and issue index codes to projects approved as part of this action.

Staff recommends approval.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

HUD monitors municipalities to make sure funds are used and not held unexpended without justification. In order to maintain compliance, the City reallocates funds that are accumulated from projects that are completed with a fund balance, projects that have not progressed to contract award or revenues from loan repayments or sale of land. The current City Council policy is to consider funding reallocations in the following manner:

- CDBG Funds from projects that were awarded on a District basis will remain in the District in which they were originally awarded.
- CDBG Program Income and funds from projects awarded to City-Wide Projects will be used to help finance district shortfalls and, to fund City-Wide endeavors.
- HOME Funds are reallocated to housing projects throughout the City with no commitment to remain in the Council District in which they were originally awarded.

Currently, there is \$1,718,532.45 of CDBG Funds available from District specific projects and \$1,297,965.59 of CDBG funds available from City-Wide program income for a total of \$3,016,498.04 of CDBG funds available for reprogramming. With regard to the HOME Program, there is currently \$1,467,965.47 available from cancelled projects and program income. Cancelled projects include projects that were funded for Tax Credit Match in May 2004. If Tax Credits were not received and no alternative financing structure was offered by the applicant by the close of the calendar year, the project is (per City Council direction), cancelled and funds awarded to said projects are available for reprogramming. Other projects recommended for reprogramming in both CDBG and HOME programs, are projects that have been completed with a fund balance and projects that could not begin within the time allowed by contract.

The projects that are included in the staff recommendation are from the following categories:

- Projects from applicants that requested reprogramming funds
- Projects with shortfalls

The purpose of a reprogramming action is to award funds to projects that are ready to go and can spend money quickly. Therefore, projects funded in this reprogramming action should begin spending within 60 days of their contract with the City. The staff recommendation for CDBG and HOME Reprogramming is included in Attachment I and II, respectively. There is no RFP process for reprogramming because reprogramming occurs when sufficient funds are accumulated. However, Staff developed a form that must be completed with each request for funding to determine if the requested amount will fully fund the project and a timeline for project implementation. Staff accepts requests throughout the year from:

- City Council Representatives
- City Departments
- Agencies and Organizations

The projects that were requested and considered for funding are included as Attachment III.

POLICY ANALYSIS

This public hearing has met the public notice and posting requirements of the Federal Government and the State of Texas. The proposed action is consistent with the Federal Requirement that the City Council take official action on and funding allocation regarding the Entitlement Programs.

FISCAL IMPACT

Approval of this ordinance will result in the reallocation and expenditure of \$3,016,498.04 in CDBG Dollars and \$1,467,965.47 of HOME Dollars with federal guidelines. Approval of this ordinance will not impact the General Fund Budget.

COORDINATION

This action was coordinated with Departments of Public Works, Community Initiatives, Parks and Recreation, Neighborhood Action and the San Antonio Housing Authority.
