Reduction of assessed fee for Northside Independent School District

SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

An ordinance reducing the increased assessed fee from \$61,648.43 to \$6,164.84 assessed against Northside Independent School District for commencing construction without a permit as requested by Councilman Barrera.

Staff recommends approval.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The following timeline explains the sequence of events that led to the increased assessed fee of \$61,648.43 assessed against Northside Independent School District:

- o April 29, 2003, NISD's architect submitted its building plan for Westcreek Area High School.
- o June 5, 2003, Development Services Department (DSD) completed its initial review of the Building Plan in 37 calendar days.
- o August 25, 2003, NISD's architect submitted its revised plans in 81 calendar days.
- August 28, 2003, DSD obtained information that NISD's architect started work without a
 permit and initiated an investigation. DSD's building inspector inspected the site; found
 work performed without a permit, and assessed a double permit fee.
- o September 4, 2003, DSD completed its review of the re-submittal package in 10 days.
- o September 4, 2003, DSD issued a conditional building permit.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Commercial building permit fees are based upon the construction value and those fees are higher than most permits. Therefore, the increased assessed fee for working without a permit is higher.

Section 107.5.2 of the 1997 Uniform Building Code states that if construction on a project begins for which a permit is required and not obtained, the specific fee may be doubled. Increased assessed fees are levied to discourage architects and contractors from completing work without a permit and to ensure construction is performed in accordance with existing codes.

Assessing an increased fee for commercial construction based upon the percentage of work completed without a permit is appropriate. Approximately ten percent of the project was completed at the time when the increased fee was assessed. DSD recommends reducing the assessed increased fee of \$61,648.43 to \$6,164.84, which is ten percent of the building permit fee.

FISCAL IMPACT

If City Council approves the fee adjustment, DSD will issue a refund to NISD's escrow account in the amount of \$55,483.59.

SUBJECT: Reduction of Northside Independent School District (NISD) Fine

DATE: March 24, 2005

I am requesting City Council concurrence in directing staff to reduce the fine of \$61,648.43 for starting construction without a permit. NISD has requested consideration of waiving or reducing the fine amount that was assessed on August 28, 2003. NISD paid the fine on September 4, 2003 and obtained a conditional permit the same day.

The fine amount was determined by the building permit amount, which was \$61,648.43. Of the total construction project, approximately 10% had been constructed without a permit. Reducing the fine amount to \$6,164.84 will fine NISD for only the construction completed. The difference between the amount paid and the reduced fine amount is \$55,483.59 and will be credited to NISD's escrow account and will be used for future NISD projects.

Your favorable consideration of this matter is requested.
