SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This Ordinance authorizes the Interim City Manager or his designee to renew the Depository Contract, approved through Ordinance No. 95596, passed and approved on April 11, 2002, with Frost National Bank, to provide depository banking and related financial services to the City of San Antonio, for a period of one (1) year, from July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2006, under the same terms and conditions.

Staff recommends approval of this Ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The City maintains bank depository services that will safeguard the City's deposits and ensure secure and efficient processing of the City's monetary collections and disbursements.

The current Depository Services Contract is a product of the competitive bid process. In 2002, bank depository services were solicited through the request for proposal (RFP) process. Four financial institutions, which include Frost National Bank, Bank of America, Bank One, and Wells Fargo submitted proposals to the City. After the review and analysis process, the Selection Committee recommended and City Council approved Frost National Bank to provide depository banking and related financial services for three (3) years, commencing on July 1, 2002, through June 30, 2005, with an option to renew for two (2) additional one (1) year periods.

Frost National Bank has a long history of providing the City with depository banking services and has demonstrated its commitment to provide quality service to the City, and has assisted the City in the evaluation and implementation of banking services and products. The City and the Depository wish to renew and extend the existing Depository Services Contract making it effective for one additional year commencing July 1, 2005 and terminating on June 30, 2006.

POLICY ANALYSIS

The City's banking policies and procedures are governed by various Federal and State statutes and the City Charter. The extension of this contract is consistent with the City's banking service practice, City policy and legal requirements.

FISCAL IMPACT

Fees for services provided are paid out of compensating balances retained in the City's bank account and invested by Frost National Bank. The fees for services and method of payment is in accordance with the existing contract without a cost increase.

COORDINATION

This action was coordinated with the City Manager's Office, City Attorney's Office, and the Department of Finance.

DEPOSITORY SERVICES CONTRACT RENEWAL AND EXTENSION

This Renewal and Extension is entered into by and between the City of San Antonio, Texas (hereinafter referred to as "CITY"), a Texas Municipal Corporation, acting by and through its Interim City Manager, or his designated representative, pursuant to Section IV., entitled "Term", of the Depository Services Contract, approved through Ordinance No. 95596, passed and approved on April 11, 2002 (hereinafter referred to as "Contract"), and The Frost National Bank (hereinafter referred to as "DEPOSITORY"), a duly incorporated financial institution domiciled in the State of Texas and authorized to perform depository services in this State, and is as follows:

WHEREAS, through Ordinance No. 95596, passed and approved on April 11, 2002, City Council authorized the execution of the Depository Services Contract with The Frost National Bank to provide banking and related services; and

WHEREAS, said Contract provides for an initial three (3) year term, with the option to renew for two (2) additional one-year terms, subject to approved by City Council; and

WHEREAS, the parties have agreed to a one-year extension of the Depository Service Contract; and

Pursuant to the provisions of Section IV., entitled "Term", of the Depository Services Contract, CITY and DEPOSITORY mutually agree to renew and extend the term of said Contract for a period of one-year, commencing July 1, 2005 and terminating June 30, 2006, under the same terms and conditions as stated in said Contract, as amended.

II.

All other terms, conditions, covenants and provisions of the Depository Services Contract approved through Ordinance No. 95596 are hereby renewed and extended.
