SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATION

A. This ordinance abolishes the Head Start Commission and establishes a new City of San Antonio Head Start Policy Commission.

B. This ordinance authorizes acceptance of a Head Start supplemental award in the amount of \$35,000 from the Department of Health and Human Services amends the delegate's contract and Head Start program budget.

Staff recommends approval of these ordinances.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The City of San Antonio is the Head Start grantee for San Antonio and Bexar County, and contracts with Parent/Child, Incorporated (PCI) to operate the program. Since 1978, PCI has operated the Head Start program, providing health, education, literacy, parental involvement activities, mental health and disabilities services at the centers as well as nutrition services at specific provider sites. The Head Start program also provides parent involvement activities at homes and at the centers. Currently, Head Start services are available at 82 child development centers throughout San Antonio and Bexar County to children between three and five years of age.

The Head Start Commission was established in response to a finding identified during the 2004 monitoring visit by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services – Administration for Children and Families (HHS-ACF). Although a Policy Council existed at the delegate agency level, ACF also identified the requirement for a Head Start Policy Council to exist at the grantee level. Ordinance No. 99349, passed and approved on June 10, 2004, established a dual level of governance at the grantee level consisting of the City of San Antonio Head Start Commission, which was given the authority to determine the makeup of the Policy Council. Through Ordinance No. 99788, passed and approved on September 23, 2004, City Council appointed the Head Start Commission members.

This ordinance rescinds a portion of Ordinance No. 99349 and all of Ordinance No. 99788 and creates a 23-member City of San Antonio Head Start Policy Commission. In accordance with Federal requirements that 51% of the Policy Council be comprised of Head Start parents, membership will include 12 Head Start parents and 11 members appointed by City Council, one by the Mayor and each Council District. The Economic and Human Development Committee recommended this action on May 19, 2005.

On April 20, 2005, HHS-ACF awarded Head Start supplemental funds in the amount of \$35,000. This award is a one-time supplement that will be used to purchase child restraints/auto safety seats (\$15,000) and classroom computers (\$20,000). This ordinance authorizes acceptance of the award and amends the Head Start program budget and the related delegate agency contract.

On March 2, 2005, HHS-ACF issued a Program Instruction capping compensation for staff paid from Head Start funds at \$162,100 per year, including benefits. This requirement impacted the salaries of PCI's Chief Executive Officer and Chief Financial Officer, which have been adjusted to comply with this mandate. Attachment A reflects the salary adjustments for these two executives.

On May 31, 2005, PCI's Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Mrs. Blanche Russ Glover retired after providing over 30 years of service to children and families in the City of San Antonio and Bexar County. She received compensation and a severance package totaling \$159,501 for the period of February 1, 2005 through May 31, 2005. The severance package is within federal guidelines and was approved by HHS-ACF on April 5, 2005. When the new CEO is hired, their salary will not exceed the HHS-ACF Employee Compensation Cap of \$162,100, including benefits.

POLICY ANALYSIS

This ordinance continues existing City policy of providing high quality early care and education to San Antonio children. This ordinance streamlines the grantee level governance structure to provide oversight of the Head Start Program. The primary role of the Head Start Policy Council will be to provide opportunities for Head Start parents and interested residents to be involved in program decision-making. Other responsibilities will include ensuring completion of the self-assessment, planning, and application process.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact from Ordinance A.

Ordinance B adds \$35,000 to the Head Start Program budget and amends the PCI delegate agency budget to reflect these additional funds and executive compensation adjustments for the Chief Executive Officer and the Chief Financial Officer.

This action requires no General Fund commitment.

COORDINATION

The Department of Community Initiatives coordinated with the City's Attorney's Office, Economic and Human Development Committee, Parent/Child, Inc., Head Start Commission, Head Start Policy Council, and the City Clerk's Office.

AN ORDINANCE

ABOLISHING THE HEAD START COMMISSION BY REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 99349, SECTION 1 AND ORDINANCE NO. 99788 EFFECTIVE JUNE 12, 2005; AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 99349, SECTION 2 TO AUTHORIZE THE SELECTION AND APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS FOR THE HEAD START POLICY COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 100361, passed and approved on January 27, 2005, authorized the acceptance of a continuation grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) for the Head Start – Early Child Care program in the amount of \$45,833,107 for a twelve month period beginning February 1, 2005; and

WHEREAS, these grant funds provide a wide range of education and social services to impoverished pre-school children and their families including educational, health, mental health and disability services provided at 87 child development centers throughout San Antonio and Bexar County to children ranging from three to five years of age; and

WHEREAS, on June 10, 2004, pursuant to Ordinance No. 99349, the City Council established the Head Start Commission: and

WHEREAS, on June 10, 2004, pursuant to Ordinance No. 99349 the City Council established the Head Start Policy Council and authorized the Head Start Commission to determine the seating of the Policy Council; and

WHEREAS, on September 23, 2004, pursuant to Ordinance No. 99788 the City Council appointed members to the Head Start Commission: and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that there is a duplicity of the governance function of the Head Start program by having both the Head Start Commission and the Head Start Policy Council; NOW THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO

Section 1. Ordinance No. 99349, Section 1, is repealed and the Head Start Commission is abolished effective June 12, 2005.

Section 2. Ordinance No. 99349, Section 2, is amended, effective June 12, 2005, to read: "The Head Start Policy Council for the Head Start program for San Antonio and Bexar County, is established. The Head Start Policy Council shall be seated as determined by City Council in accordance with federal regulation."

Section 3. Ordinance No. 99788 is repealed effective June 12, 2005.

Section 4. This ordinance shall become es	ffective on and after J	une 12, 2005.

AN ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF A GRANT FROM THE U.S. **DEPARTMENT** OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES ADMINISTRATION FOR CHILDREN AND FAMILIES IN THE AMOUNT OF \$35,000.00 FOR THE PURCHASE OF CHILD RESTRAINTS/AUTO SAFETY SEATS AND CLASSROOM COMPUTERS FOR THE HEAD START PROGRAM AND REVISING THE HEAD START PROGRAM BUDGET IN CONNECTION THEREWITH; AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF AN AMENDMENT TO THE AGENCY CONTRACT DELEGATE WITH PARENT/CHILD. INCORPORATED (PCI) REVISING THE PCI HEAD START PROGRAM BUDGET.

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 100361, passed and approved on January 27, 2005, authorized the acceptance of a continuation grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services – Administration for Children and Families (HHS-ACF) for the Head Start – Early Child Care program in the amount of \$45,833,107 for a twelve month period beginning February 1, 2005; and

WHEREAS, these grant funds provide a wide range of education and social services to impoverished pre-school children and their families including educational, health, mental health and disability services provided at 87 child development centers throughout San Antonio and Bexar County to children ranging from three to five years of age; and

WHEREAS, HHS-ACF has awarded additional Financial Assistance in the amount of \$35,000.00 for the purchase of child restraints and classroom computers for the Head Start program; and

WHEREAS, On March 2, 2005, the HHS-ACF issued a Program Instruction requiring Head Start program executive compensation to be no more than \$162,100.00 per year which now requires a revision to the Head Start program budget; NOW THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO

Section 1. The Interim City Manager, or his designee, or the Director of the Department of Community Initiatives is authorized to accept an award of \$35,000.00 from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Service – Administration of Children and Families, for the purchase of child restraints and classroom computers for the Head Start program. A copy of the grant award is attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes as Attachment I.

Section 2. The revised budget for Fund 26, Internal Order 138000000305 and 138000000309, SAP GL Accounts 5202025 and 6602025, entitled, "2005 Head Start Early Child Care Program", attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes as Attachment II, is approved.

Section 3. The Interim City Manager, or his designee, or the Director of the Department of Community Initiatives is authorized to execute an amendment to the delegate agency contract with Parent/Child Incorporated (PCI) to revise the agency's budget to reflect the acceptance of the grant referenced in Section 1 of this ordinance and to revise the amounts for personnel and related expenses of PCI to comply with federal requirements concerning executive compensation. A copy of the delegate agency contract amendment, in substantially final form, is attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes as Attachment III.

Section 4. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Director of Finance, City of San Antonio. The Director of Finance may, subject to concurrence by the Interim City Manager, or the Interim City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal Orders, SAP Cost Centers, and SAP GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

Section 4. This ordinance shall become effective on and after June 12, 2005.
