SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATION

This ordinance terminates the Selrico Services, Inc. contract, as authorized by Ordinance No. 99782, effective May 31, 2005, and accepts the best value bid of Selrico Services, Inc. for meal preparation and delivery services for the Comprehensive Nutrition Project (CNP) for the period June 1, 2005 through September 30, 2006 for an approximate cost of \$3,038,918.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Comprehensive Nutrition Project (CNP) was established in 1973, as an integral part of the Department of Community Initiatives' (DCI) elderly and disabled continuum of services. Stemming from the concerns of a few nutrition sites regarding the quality of food provided by Selrico and in the interest of providing the best meal value, City Council requested DCI issue a request for Best Value Bids for the CNP program. Selrico Services, Inc. was the sole bidder. This vendor has invested approximately \$145,000 to ensure continued quality improvements and to accommodate the current CNP contract. Selrico has agreed to waive the 90-day notice to terminate the existing contract and initiate a new contract without penalty or fees.

Today, the City's CNP project is the largest senior nutrition congregate setting in the State. DCI serves up to 4,000 meals per day to seniors, aged 60 and older. The City operates the CNP using General Funds and Title III-C federal funds awarded by the Texas Department on Aging (TDoA) through the Alamo Area Council of Governments (AACOG).

This ordinance will terminate Selrico's current contract as of May 31, 2005, and accept the new bid, which provides for an increased level of services. The new contract will begin on June 1, 2005 and terminate on September 30, 2006, with a two-year renewal option that may be exercised with City Council approval.

The new contract requires an increase in the number of meals purchased daily and raises the cost per meal from \$2.20 to \$2.25 per meal, provided 3,800 meals are purchased daily. The City currently purchases 3,700 meals per day. If fewer that 3,800 meals are purchased, the cost rises to \$2.50. After allowing for both the increased meal quantity and cost, it is estimated that there will be an end of year fund surplus of \$88,000. The additional 100 meals purchased daily will allow for the potential expansion of the Senior Nutrition Program in Council Districts 8, 9 and 10.

POLICY ANALYSIS

This ordinance addresses the core issue of safety net services and reflects a continuation of existing City policy to provide services that improve the quality of life of senior citizens in San Antonio and Bexar County and assist them in maintaining independent living. The AACOG grant, along with the City's General Fund match, will allow the CNP to continue providing nutrition services to the elderly at 71 nutrition sites. A list of nutrition sites is provided as Attachment A. Performance measures for this program are based on anticipated funding levels and provided as Attachment B.

FISCAL IMPACT

Historically, AACOG has made an annual grant award, then provided an initial funding allocation that is less than the total grant award. AACOG then subsequently supplements its initial allocations during the funding year as additional funds become available. AACOG's FY04–05 grant award is \$1,677,092 with an initial grant allocation of approximately \$1,182,133 for congregate and home delivered meals. Any future funding received during the fiscal year will be directed towards additional direct services. For FY04-05, the COSA General Fund will match the grant at 69% of the program's total budget, based on AACOG's initial funding allocation.

COORDINATION

The Department of Community Initiatives coordinated activities with the City Attorney's Office, Office of Budget and Management, Purchasing and General Services, and the Finance Department.
