of the Governor, Criminal Justice Division (CJD) for Project EASE

#### **SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

This ordinance authorizes the City Manager, or his designated representative, to accept a \$91,559 grant from the Office of the Governor, Criminal Justice Division (CJD) for the fourth year of the Project Educate, Assess, Serve and Empower (EASE) of the Victims Advocacy Section. The grant period is July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2006.

Staff recommends approval.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

Project EASE utilizes professional contractors, supervised by a grant funded Program Coordinator to provide services to victims of violent crime who are deaf. Grant funds will also be used for professional translation services, community outreach and education programs, the purchase of office and project supplies, training for project personnel and support of existing computer equipment.

This grant, from the Office of the Governor, CJD, will fund the fourth year of Project EASE in the Victims Advocacy Section. The City will contribute matching funds in the amount of \$22,890 through existing staff time and volunteer hours (no cash match is required). This grant was initially funded for fiscal year 2002-03 and just completed its third year.

CJD requires the citing of the grant application certification number (16211-04), the specific naming of the "Authorized Grant Official", specific delineation of the type and amount of match being provided and specific language to be included in the ordinance authorizing the acceptance of the grant.

#### **POLICY ANALYSIS**

This ordinance continues City Council's policy of seeking intergovernmental financial assistance for City crime prevention and enforcement programs. The program will enhance the City's efforts in dealing with domestic violence and victims of domestic violence by providing services to victims who are deaf.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**

The Office of the Governor, Criminal Justice Division, will provide Grant funds for a total of \$91,559. Volunteer hours provided and existing staff time would be considered an in-kind match of \$22,890 and there is no cash match required.

#### **COORDINATION**

This ordinance request has been coordinated with Finance, City Attorney's Office and the Office of Management & Budget.
