SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance appropriates funds in the amount of \$11,580 payable to Lawyers Title of San Antonio as escrow agent for Episcopal Church Corporation in West Texas, for Fee Simple Title to one parcel of land (\$11,080), and Title Fees (\$500); and authorizes funds in the amount of \$100 payable to Episcopal Church Corporation in West Texas for a Right of Entry Agreement, for a total amount of \$11,680 in connection with the Stahl Road – O'Connor to Judson project, an authorized 2003-2007 General Obligation Street Improvement Bond project, located in Council District 10.

Staff recommends the approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The scope of work for this project includes reconstruction and widening of the existing two-lane roadway to four lanes with raised medians, left turn lanes, and associated drainage improvements. This project is funded through construction and is currently in the final design phase. Advertisement for project construction is scheduled for February 2006. Project construction is anticipated to begin in May 2006 and to be completed in November 2007.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to complete previously approved Capital Improvement Projects.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is a one-time capital expenditure within budget and included in the FY06-FY11 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$11,680 are available from 2003 General Obligation Street Improvement Bonds and are authorized to be appropriated for Right of Way acquisition related expenditures payable as follows:
