SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance appropriates funds and amends a professional services agreement in the amount of \$82,747 payable to Pape-Dawson Engineers, Inc., authorizes project contingency in the amount of \$8,275, authorizes \$6,371.54 for Capital Administrative Costs and \$1,500 for environmental services for a total ordinance amount of \$98,893.54 for professional engineering services in connection with the Salado Creek Hike and Bike, Phase I Project, an authorized 1999-2004 General Obligation Flood Control with Park Improvement Bond and Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) funded project, located in Council District 2.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This project provides for the construction of a hike and bike trail from Willow Springs Golf Course to Comanche Park. This project also provides for approximately 1600 feet of trail realignment in order to alleviate right-of-way issues in the area of creek crossing No. 2. Project construction is scheduled to begin in June 2006 and to be completed by June 2007.

This ordinance authorizes funding in the amount of \$82,747 payable to Pape-Dawson Engineers, Inc. for additional professional engineering services which will include updating the topographic data for various creek crossings located within the project limits. These additional services are necessary to account for changes in topography due to natural erosion that has occurred since the design of the project began. This fee also includes updates to plans and quantities necessary to reflect the realigned trail. These services are outlined in the consultant's proposals included herein as Attachment 2.

The professional service agreement for the Salado Creek Hike and Bike, Phase I Project was approved by City Council on November 23, 1999 through Ordinance No. 90848 and authorized \$195,000 for professional engineering services. Subsequent council action has increased the amount approved for this agreement to \$446,500. This ordinance will increase the total agreement amount to \$545,394.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to participate in the development and construction of previously approved 1999-2004 General Obligation Flood Control with Park Improvement Bond and City selected and approved Metropolitan Planning Organization funded Capital Improvement Projects, which are approved annually by City Council.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure and is included in the FY 06-11 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$98,893.54 are available from 1999-2004 General Obligation Flood Control with Park Improvement Bond funds and are appropriated and payable as follows:

\$ 6,371.54	for capital administrative costs
\$ 1,500.00	for environmental services





Dear Mr. Bayer:

As requested, please accept this request for additional services for the project referenced above to accommodate services related to trail realignment, updated creek crossing survey data and locating the limits of excavation for Crossing Nos. 4 and 6. In providing these services we would like to note the assistance of the following subconsultants:

- Poznecki-Camarillo will be providing the surveying services;
- Rialto Studios will be providing the landscape architecture services.

The services provided under this request will address the direction by the City of San Antonio to realign approximately 1600-ft of trail in order alleviate right-of-way issues in the area Crossing No. 2. The services will also include updating the topographic data for the other current creek crossings to account for changes in topography due to natural erosion processes since design of the project began. Below is the break down of the services divide

SCOPE OF SERVICES I.

Task 1: Survey

- Recovery of horizontal and vertical control for the complete project.
- Update the vertical survey information for the 5 proposed creek crossings.
 - Information will include bathymetry of the creek at the crossing locations.
- Field staking of the trail centerline with left and right top of slopes at Crossing Nos. 4 and 6.
- Tie-in existing underground utility markings in vicinity of Crossing No. 6 to project control and depict on plans.
- Survey data for the trail realignment at J-Street Park, which will include a tree inventory.

Task 2: Design

- Update trail profile for new crossing data at all creek crossings.
- Update HEC-2 model for new crossing data and revised Crossing No. 2 location.
- Update Scour Analysis for new crossing data and revised Crossing No. 2 location.
- Walk trail realignment options at J-Street Park and evaluate with City Staff.
- Update horizontal alignment and create equation stations for realigned trail.
- Develop and design profile for realigned trail.
- Provide revised schematic depicting trail realignment for submittal to TxDOT.
- Update plans and quantities to reflect realigned trail.
- Update plans to reflect new creek crossing data.

II. COMPENSATION

Basis of Compensation

We respectfully request our current budget be increased by the amount of \$82,747. This increase will account for trail realignment, additional surveying and crossing redesign. We have prepared the attached project fee summary in support of this request. The fee breakdown is as follows:
