SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This item is a request to appoint Ed Garza to the board of directors ("Board") for the City South Management Authority (the "CSMA"), to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Charles Villafranca. Mr. Garza, if appointed, will serve the remainder of a two-year term, to expire June 30, 2007. This ordinance will also provide for waivers of Section 2-402 of the City Code regarding the process for at-large appointments for this appointee.

Staff recommends approval.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

One of the goals of the City is to balance San Antonio's growth by attracting new residents and businesses by promoting sustainable development and economic growth in an area rich with environmental, historical, human and economic resources. One method to achieve that goal was the creation of a Municipal Management District called a Defense Adjustment Management Authority in the statutorily eligible area known as City South, under the provisions of Chapter 375 of the Local Government Code (the "Act").

The CSMA was created on May 19, 2005, and is located within the geographic boundaries of the City South, and comprises that land within City South that has been annexed for limited purposes. The CSMA is a governmental entity and a political subdivision of the state of Texas. As such, the Board is granted the power to generate and approve the Authority Plan, which shall detail the plans and design for the development, construction, and financing of eligible projects within the CSMA. The Board may issue notes and bonds with prior approval of the City, but may not levy ad valorem taxes.

The Board consists of 15 members. Six (6) are appointed by the City; six (6) are appointed by the County; and three (3) are collectively appointed by the school districts within the CSMA.

Directors are appointed for two-year terms, which may be staggered, and members may be reappointed to serve successive terms. A vacancy is filled for the unexpired term by the appointing entity. Directors may be removed from office by the City Council after posting notice and holding a hearing. The Mayor and the Bexar County Judge shall alternatively appoint the presiding officer of the Board to a four-year term, with the Mayor making the first appointment. The Board may, at its discretion, elect an assistant presiding officer and any additional officers it considers appropriate.

The Act provides that a majority of the directors of the Authority must meet the qualifications of Section 375.063, which states that to be eligible to serve on the board, a person must be at least 18 years old and at least one of the following:

- An owner of property in the district;
- An owner of stock of a corporate owner of property in the district;
- An owner of a beneficial interest in a trust that owns property in the district; or
- An agent, employee or tenant of one of the above.

In addition, representatives or agents of a school district whose boundaries overlap those of the Authority, or of an institution of higher education that operates facilities within the Authority, may serve on the board.

Section 375.064 contains further requirements for municipal appointees to the board of a Municipal Management District. Specifically, the governing body of the municipality shall make appointments to the board so that places on the board are occupied by persons with experience in one or more of the following areas:

- (1) energy matters;
- (2) commercial banking;
- (3) real estate development;
- (4) finance and insurance matters;
- (5) matters relating to retail or the provision of services;
- (6) provision of utilities; or
- (7) general issues the district will address.

While Mr. Garza does not meet one of the four requirements listed in Section 375.063, a majority of the Board appointed to date do fulfill those requirements as stated in the law. Further, he meets the experience criteria in all seven areas under Section 375.064 from his experience as Mayor of San Antonio.

This ordinance will grant a waiver of Section 2-402 of the City Code, regarding the at-large board appointment process for City Boards and Commissions.

POLICY ANALYSIS

This appointment to the Board will enable the CSMA to further the implementation of City South through land use controls to the area, the facilitation of educational enhancement opportunities in the area and ensure the protection of the investment that has been made in City South.

In July of 2004 the City Council, by Ordinance Number 101119, amended the rules governing the creation and operation of all boards and commissions created by ordinance or resolution passed by the City of San Antonio City Council. These rules apply to this Board, except as provided otherwise by state law.

Due to the unique nature of the Board, and in an effort to comply with this new Ordinance, staff requests that these board appointments be exempted from Chapter 2, Article VIII, Section 2-402 of the City of San Antonio City Code regarding at-large appointments, for these appointees.

FISCAL IMPACT

Completion of the board appointments will allow the CSMA to begin operations, which are provided for in the FY 2005-6 Budget.
