SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance authorizes funds in the amount of \$1,222.50 payable to Lawyers Title of San Antonio for title services in connection with the James Park Development and Holbrook Road Improvements Project (\$622.50), located in Council District 2, and the Prue Road Extension – Prue to Huebner MPO Project (\$600), located in Council District 8. These projects are funded from General Obligations of the City.

Staff recommends the approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

James Park Development and Holbrook Road Improvements Project

The scope of this project provides for drainage, roadway and intersection improvements at the intersection of Rittiman and Holbrook, and Aina and Holbrook. An 8-foot shared use path will be installed on Holbrook from Eisenhauer to Aina, and on Aina from Holbrook to Rittiman. This project is under construction and completion is anticipated in March 2006.

Prue Road Extension - Prue to Huebner (MPO)

This project will provide for the extension of the roadway on a new alignment, which will include four lanes and a raised center median, curbs, sidewalks and necessary drainage. The extended roadway will also connect to Huebner and Research. A Signal is to be included at Huebner and Research. Construction will begin in March 2006 and completion is anticipated in March 2007.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance for payment of title services is necessary to complete the real estate transactions on the acquisition of properties in these projects.

FISCAL IMPACT

James Park Development and Holbrook Road Improvements

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure not within budget and is not included in the FY06-FY11 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$622.50 are available from 1994 General Obligation Drainage Improvement Bonds by transferring funds from the Quintana Road Drainage #64 extension construction contingency.

Prue Road Extension – Prue to Huebner (MPO)

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure within budget and included in the FY06-FY11 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$600 are available from 1999 General Obligation Street Improvement Bonds.
