DATE: January 5, 2006

SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance authorizes funds in the amount of \$12,675.29 payable to Davidson & Troilo, P.C., for legal services in connection with the Babcock Road/Leon Creek Improvements-Hausman to DeZavala project (\$9,548.65), located in Council District 8; Culebra/Loop 410 Detention Pond project (\$1,677.60), located in Council District 6; Loop 410 at Nacogdoches Drainage Improvement project (\$1,251.04), located in Council Districts 9 and 10; and the Mission Trails Package IV project (\$198), located in Council Districts 1, 3, and 5. These projects are funded from General Obligations of the City and Community Development Block Grant Funds.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The invoices for these legal services have been reviewed for accuracy by the City Attorney's Office who recommends payment as requested.

Babcock Road/Leon Creek Improvements – Hausman to DeZavala

There are 22 signed instruments and 4 condemned parcels in the 26-parcel project. Construction on this project is complete.

Culebra/Loop 410 Detention Pond – There is one signed instrument and one parcel pending legal resolution in this two-parcel project. Construction on this project is complete.

Loop 410 at Nacogdoches Drainage Improvements - There are six signed instruments and one condemned parcel in the nine-parcel project. The remaining two parcels have been submitted to the City Attorney's Office for condemnation proceedings. This project is currently under construction and scheduled to be completed in June 2007. The scope of this project includes the construction of drainage improvements from I.H. 410 just west of Nacogdoches to Haskin.

Mission Trails Package IV – There are eight signed instruments and one condemned parcel in the 10-parcel project. The remaining parcel has been submitted to the City Attorney's office for condemnation proceedings. The scope of this project provides for street and drainage improvements and enhancements, such as sidewalks and brick pavers, on Mission Road from

Mitchell to Roosevelt and on Roosevelt from Mission Road to St. Mary's Street. Enhancements are also included on Alamo from Durango to Alamo Plaza. This phase is currently funded for design and right of way acquisition only.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Charges for such services are reasonable and necessary expenses related to the above mentioned projects.

FISCAL IMPACT

Babcock Road/Leon Creek Improvements – Hausman to DeZavala

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure within budget. This expenditure was not included in the FY06-FY11 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Approval of this ordinance will appropriately modify the Capital Budget. Funds in the amount of \$9,548.65 are available from the previously authorized project contingency.

Culebra/Loop 410 Detention Pond

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure within budget and is not included in the FY06-FY11 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$1,677.60 are available from the previously authorized project contingency.

Loop 410 at Nacogdoches Drainage Improvements

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure within budget and not included in the FY06-FY11 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$1,251.04 are available from 2001 Certificates of Obligation.

Mission Trails Package IV

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure within budget and is included in the FY 06-FY11 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$198 available from 2002 Certificates of Obligation.






