SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATION

An Ordinance authorizing a license for an existing canopy and supporting posts extending into Public Right of Way at Karam's Restaurant, 121 N. Zarzamora St., NCB 2289, District 5, for a 10-year term and for a \$5,000 fee.

Staff recommends approval of this Ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Petitioner is requesting a license renewal for the continued use of Public Rights of Way over North Zarzamora and West Houston Streets for an existing canopy along with its supporting posts at the Karam's Restaurant located at 121 N. Zarzamora St. in NCB 2289 as shown on attached Exhibit "A."






