SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance accepts a proposal and authorizes a professional services agreement in the amount of \$50,000.00 for professional consulting services payable to the University of Texas at San Antonio (UTSA), in connection with the Management Practices for Natural Waterways project, an authorized Tree Mitigation funded project.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Natural waterways are located throughout the City and include the region's major creeks, rivers, and other natural lows that convey storm water. This project provides for the development of a document that comprehensively addresses activities such as flood debris removal, removal of invasive exotics, erosion control, tree and understory vegetation management, reseeding and/or re-vegetation for natural waterways within each of the unique riparian zones. This document will be used by City forces, contractors and private citizens. The intent is to develop a single reference document that contains management practices, appropriate reference materials and associated curriculums for trainings. This information will be available on the City's website. The term of the contract will begin in February 2006 and will terminate in December of 2006.

The document will include information on the specifics of the methods and will provide information that will increase the users understanding of the impact of each activity and how that activity, in general, affects the complex interactions within the water ways; including hydrological and ecological interactions. The priority consideration of impact is the effect on water quantity and quality in these areas. The document will be coordinated with an ad hoc committee comprised of stakeholders listed in the Tree Preservation ordinance, which is comprised of one representative from the Cibolo Creek watershed, the Leon Creek Coalition, the Salado Creek Foundation, the San Antonio River Oversight Committee, and the Land Heritage Institute (for the Medina River). At a minimum, additional stakeholders shall include Bexar County, San Antonio River Authority (SARA), the Bexar Regional Watershed Management Committee, the Linear Creekway Parks Advisory Board, and the City's Parks and Recreation Department. These management practices will be in accordance with City policies and procedures, as well as, the Creekways Planning and Design Guidelines.

The consultant was selected following the City's release of a Request for Proposals to which two (2) firms responded. The Public Works Architectural and Engineering (A/E) Selection Committee met and discussed the statements of qualifications, as well as their evaluations for each of the submitting firms. After careful consideration, the Committee selected UTSA, which was the number one ranked firm. The Evaluation of Qualification Statements Review Summary is included herein as Attachment 1. UTSA currently has no projects with the City.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to fulfill the requirements of the Tree Preservation ordinance and will enhance the City's understanding and management of environmental issues.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is a one-time expenditure within budget and included in the FY 06-11 Adopted Budget. Funds in the amount of \$50,000.00 are available from Tree Mitigation funds to be payable as follows:

\$50,000.00 payable to UTSA for professional consulting services

COORDINATION

This request has been coordinated with the Office of Management and Budget, the Finance Department, Development Services Department, the Department of Parks and Recreation, Contract Services Department, the Economic Development Department and the City Attorney's Office.
