SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

An ordinance authorizing funds in the amount of \$87,800.00 payable to Ameripoint Title Company as Escrow Agent for Marcus Crassus Land, Ltd. for Fee Simple Title to two parcels of land (\$86,800.00), and Title Fees (\$1,000.00); and authorizing funds in the amount of \$100.00 payable to Marcus Crassus Land, Ltd. for a Right of Entry Fee, for a total amount of \$87,900.00 in connection with Military Ditch#65 Project, an authorized 2003 Storm Water Revenue Bond project located in Council District 4.

Staff recommends the approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Military Ditch #65 project provides for the drainage improvements to the Six Mile Creek main channel from the north side of Zarzamora, located at the end of the Upper Six Mile Creek project to Wagner. Project construction is anticipated to begin in August 2006 and to be completed by January 2008.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to complete previously approved Capital Improvement Projects.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure within budget and included in the FY06-FY11 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$87,900.00 are available from 2003 Storm Water Revenue Bonds and are authorized to be appropriated for right of way acquisition related expenditures payable as follows:


