### **SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

An Ordinance authorizing a license agreement with University United Methodist Church to construct, operate and maintian a pedestrian skybridge over and across De Zavala Road, between NCB's 17142 & 14857, located in Council District No. 8, for a ten-year term and the consideration of \$15,732.00.

Staff recommends approval of this Ordinance.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

Petitioner is requesting a license to construct, operate and maintain a skybridge over and across the 5000 block of De Zavala Road, between NCB's 17142 & 14857, as shown on attached Exhibits "A", "B" and "C". The University United Methodist Church is undertaking a building program which will involve a new facility located on the north side of De Zavala across from the existing main campus. The skybridge is the preferred method to accomplish a safe pedestrian passage across De Zavala Road. The minimum height of the skybridge from street grade level will be 16 feet.

### **POLICY ANALYSIS**

This action is consistent with the City Code and Ordinances which require City Council approval for any private use of property owned or controlled by the City.

### **FISCAL IMPACT**

The City will collect \$15,732.00 for this license to use Public Right of Way.

### **COORDINATION**

In compliance with City procedures, this request has been canvassed through interested City departments, public utilities and applicable agencies. A Canvassing Checklist and an executed Letter of Agreement, by which the petitioner agrees with all conditions imposed through this canvassing, are attached for review.

### SUPPLEMENTARY COMMENTS

The City of San Antonio's Planning Commission recommended approval of this request at its regular meeting of 3/22/2006.





Dear Mr. Martin:

With reference to the captioned projects, please be advised that the City of San Antonio has now completed the canvassing process and will recommend approval of your request subject to the following conditions:

### SAN ANTONIO WATER SYSTEM:

Petitioner must agree to reserve a perpetual easement for all existing water and/or sewer facilities and agrees to allow perpetual access to any such utilities for inspection, operational and maintenance purposes or may seek the relocation of the facilities with the express permission and coordination with the San Antonio Water System and at the sole expense of the petitioner.

#### **CITY PUBLIC SERVICE ENERGY:**

Existing overhead facilities would need to be raised to meet NESC clearances for sky bridge. Other facilities (Time Warner, SBC, traffic signal) would all have to be taken into consideration for NESC code. Also, petitioner would be responsible for costs incurred with rebuild. Owner must submit encroachment request to CPS Energy, right of way section to process through engineering for review once overhead facilities have been converted to UG (underground).

### **DEVELOPMENT SERVICES DEPARTMENT:**

The request for a License to construct, operate and maintain a sky bridge over and across the 5000 Block of De Zavala road is recommended for approval provided that construction plans are submitted and proper permits and required inspections are obtained.

Exhibit "C" Page 1 of 2 Additionally, the fee established for this license agreement is \$15,732.00 for a 10-year term, to be paid to the City of San Antonio prior to City Council consideration. If for some reason the license is not approved by City Council the license fee will be returned to the petitioner. Also, a Certificate of Insurance must be provided and the City of San Antonio must be formally released from any and all liabilities, which may be incurred in connection with this request. Further, a fully completed and signed Discretionary Contracts Disclosure Statement is required and enclosed for your convenience.

If you concur with the above mentioned conditions, including the payment of the fee established for this encroachment, please countersign this letter in the space provided below and return to the undersigned. Upon receipt of this signed Discretionary Contracts Disclosure Statement, Letter of Agreement and the Certificate of Insurance we will continue processing your request.

This Letter of Agreement is being offered by the City of San Antonio only to the above named petitioner and will expire thirty (30) days after the date of issuance unless a specific extension is requested by the petitioner and granted by the City.
