SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

An ordinance accepting a proposal and amending an existing professional services agreement and appropriating funds in the amount of \$32,835.00 payable to Vickrey and Associates, Inc., authorizing \$3,283.50 for project contingency, authorizing \$2,528.30 for Capital Administrative Costs, and authorizing \$2,000.00 for construction phase Advertising Costs, for a total ordinance amount of \$40,646.80 in connection with the Military Ditch #65 project, an authorized 2003 Storm Water Revenue funded project, located in Council District 4.

The professional service agreement for the Military Ditch #65 project was approved by City Council on August 31, 2000 through Ordinance No. 92423 and authorized \$159,554.18 for professional engineering services. Subsequent council action has increased the amount approved for this agreement to \$216,554.18. This ordinance will increase the total agreement amount to \$249,389.18.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This project provides for drainage improvements to the Six-Mile Creek main channel from the north side of Zarzamora (end of Upper Six-Mile Creek project) to Wagner. This project is currently still under design and has not been advertised. Project construction is estimated to begin in August of 2006 and to be completed by January of 2008.

This ordinance authorizes funding in the amount of \$32,835.00 payable to Vickrey and Associates, Inc. for additional professional engineering services not addressed in the original project scope such as providing survey services to update the final construction plans. These additional services will provide a project control sheet and aid in the design of a temporary driveway allowing access to Falcon Bank. These additional services are necessary to complete the design of the project.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to complete previously approved 2003 Storm Water Revenue funded projects.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure and is included in the FY 06-11 Capital Improvement Program Budget. Funds in the amount of \$40,646.80 are available from 2003 Storm Water Revenue funds and are appropriated and payable as follows:

\$ 2,000.00	for advertising costs


