SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Arts in the Community Program (AiC). This Ordinance authorizes the City Manager or her designee of the City of San Antonio ("City") to execute the First Amendment to the Delegate Agency Agreement for the *Pieces of the Neighborhood* Project replacing the original project with El Gran Dia de Los Artistas.

City Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Arts in the Community Program: On January 29, 2004, City and Centro Cultural Aztlan with the Woodlawn Lake Community Association as the community partner, entered into the Arts in the Community Delegate Agency Agreement pursuant to City of San Antonio Ordinance No. 98757 for the project entitled "Pieces of the Neighborhood" in the amount of \$16,000.00.

Pieces of the Neighborhood, was a collaborative art project in Council District 7. The partners, along with artists and area residents, were to develop an interactive kinetic sculpture blending the cultural and environmental elements present at the Woodlawn Lake area. Basic workshops on a variety of techniques to guide the participants through the process of creating the metal components were to be offered in the Galeria Expression at Centro Cultural Aztlan.

Since the execution of the Agreement, financial considerations necessitated the project be downscaled from the original concept. The community partner has withdrawn its support for the project because they felt "the project as it now stands is not as was envisioned when we made our grant application to the City's Office of Cultural Affairs." Further, they state, "We feel it is best for all concerned... that the project "Pieces of the Community (sic)" be cancelled in its entirety. (Letter is attached (See Attachment I). No payments have been made under the current agreement.

The Contractor in this project, Centro Cultural Aztlan has stepped forward with an alternate project, "El Gran Dia de los Artistas" which is an artistic and creative event to be held in District 7. The Monticello Park Neighborhood Association and Bihl Haus Arts, both located in District 7, represent that they are willing and able to go into a partnership with Centro Cultural Aztlan in this endeavor.

El Gran Dia de Los Artistas will coincide with the Deco Days of the Jefferson Woodlawn Lake CDC in September, 2006. The event will begin with a Community Photo Exhibit of area photographers to be held at Bihl Haus Arts Center and will be the staging area for the participants of a neighborhood parade. A Native American Blessing will initiate the parade and it will travel down Fredericksburg Road towards Centro Cultural Aztlan's new home located in the Deco Building, formerly the Travis Building. Letters of support are attached (See Attachment II).

Approval of the proposal will impact a large number of the community in that it will involve more neighborhood groups and advance business alliances and community support in a neighborhood that is currently undergoing a tremendous amount of revitalization.

POLICY ANALYSIS

This request is consistent with The Cultural Collaborative's objective to provide greater access to arts and culture to residents throughout San Antonio and supports community partnering projects among homeowner associations, business alliances, neighborhood associations, community groups, and the arts community.

FISCAL IMPACT

Approval of this request will not require the appropriation of additional funds and will not affect the City's General Fund. The funding comes from the Community and Visitors Facilities Fund.

COORDINATION

This request has been coordinated with the Cultural Arts Board, District 7 Councilwoman Elena Guajardo, the Office of Management and Budget, the Finance Department, and the City Attorney's Office.

Dear Ms Gonzalez-Cid:

The Woodlawn Lake Community Association has voted to discontinue our participation in the Arts in the Community project "Pieces of the Community." The project is the one in which we joined with Centro Cultural Aztlan in 2003 and which was approved by the City of San Antonio in January 2004.

Our project chair, Rita Maria Contreras, informed us 2 weeks ago that she could not continue her involvement with this project. At our regular meeting on January 31st, we considered whether the project could be coordinated by another individual and whether, at this point, we still believed that the project was worth pursuing.

We feel that the project as it now stands is not as was envisioned when we made our grant application to the City's Office of Cultural Affairs. On July 31, 2003, in support of the application, I told that office:

"[The project] will bring an artistic and cultural element to a focal point of the inner northwest community that will be designed and developed by the area residents. It will become a living and growing monument with which its visitors can interact as they enjoy its features. As the project envisions the participation of the area schools in its inception and as it later evolves, we believe that the youths of the community will identify with the project and in turn strengthen their ties to the community as a whole."

We understand that the cost of the original concept was later projected to far exceed the amount of the grant. For that reason, the project was revamped and redesigned. We feel that Rita has done an excellent job in trying to fit all the original elements into the revised design. However, in looking at the current project papers, it appears questionable whether the project as it now stands could be completed within the confines of the grant. Further, even if another person could step in and continue Rita's work and get it within bounds of the grant, the end product would not be consistent with the theme that our Association had at the onset endorsed.

We feel that it is best for all concerned, the sponsoring organizations, the project workers, the City's Office of Cultural Affairs and the Parks and Recreation Department, and the many people who visit and enjoy Woodlawn Lake Park, that the project "Pieces of the Community" be cancelled in its entirety. We know that several people have given their time and energy in trying to make this project a reality. For their sakes and for the best interests of our organizations, it is best to stop now before investing any funds or additional labor.

Please let me know if you agree to end this project. If you do agree, I will pass that information on to the City. If you choose to continue alone or with another partner, I will advise the City of our Association's withdrawal and leave it to you to make any other needed arrangements. It is our view, however, that the proposed structure should not be placed in Woodlawn Lake Park.

Centro Cultural Aztlán, soon to be located in the Deco District on Fred Rd., and Bihl Haus Arts (BHA), 2803 Fredericksburg Rd., have formed a partnership to organize "El Día de los Artistas" parade and arts festival. The event draws inspiration from "El Día de los Locos" in San Miguel Allende, Guanajuato, Mexico, a mid-summer ritual that brings the numerous visual, literary, and performing artists active in San Miguel together once a year to celebrate their multiple art forms and cultures. The San Miguel parade and festival unite ancient masking and costume traditions with contemporary performance, literary, and musical arts. It is the perfect model for a celebration of the arts in the Deco District where so many artists—more than 100—from various arts disciplines live and/or work in the surrounding neighborhoods. It is a wonderful place to live and make art, but where, until only recently, there have been few venues through which to promote the work these artists do.

Centro Cultural Aztlán and Bihl Haus Arts propose that "El Día de los Artistas" take place annually, beginning in September 2006, in San Antonio's Deco District during Deco Days, initiated last September by the CDC on Fred. Bihl Haus Arts actively supported the first Deco Days celebration by holding its inaugural exhibition on Friday, Sept. 10. That exhibition highlighted the art of 17 of the more than 40 practicing professional visual artists who live and work in the surrounding area. In addition, on Sunday, Sept. 12, BHA hosted a poetry reading, organized by Trinidad Sanchez, Jr., which featured the work of several area poets. This inaugural event was extremely well attended—more than 750 people visited the gallery over the opening weekend. The overwhelming support from the surrounding communities for the inaugural weekend and for events held at BHA since then suggests that our area is primed to support and promote the arts if only a venue were created. "El Día de los Artistas" could be that . . . and more! Other local arts groups—the Flamenco dance studio, Askew, the stained glass studio—together with area schools (Jefferson High School is an arts magnet; many of its arts instructors also live in our area) would be invited to make masks and costumes, and create dance, performance, and musical works for the parade and the arts festival that follows it.

"El Día de los Artistas" would begin with a light brunch at Bihl Haus Arts where participants would organize and then parade downhill on Fred to Centro Aztlan. The arts festival would continue in the new parking lot behind Centro and the Deco Building, where stages for performance and arts and food booths would be set up. Businesses along the parade route could participate by sponsoring artists' storefront installations, modeled after "Arts on Fred" that took place a few years ago. September is also the time for FotoSeptiembre, and BHA and Centro will host photography exhibitions to coincide with that city-wide event (both spaces are already working on these exhibitions).

We believe the time is right in the Deco District to create a neighborhood arts event to highlight the work of the numerous talented and creative individuals who live and work here. Although "El Día de los Artistas" has not yet been formally proposed to the CDC, several CDC Board members are very supportive of the idea and they have offered to present this proposal to the rest of the board at the next meeting. This proposal will also be brought to the next board and community meetings of area neighborhood associations, which have been so supportive of BHA over the past year, and we anticipate enthusiastic support from them as well.

The support of OCA to bring this innovative, fun, and fresh celebration of the arts to the Deco District and to San Antonio is crucial to the success of this project. I thank you in advance for your kind consideration of this proposal. If there is any further information I can offer in regard to this project, please do not hesitate to contact me.
