SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

An ordinance accepting the lowest responsive bid, appropriating funds, and awarding a construction contract in the amount \$5,425,671.00 payable to Texas Sterling Construction, L.P., an SBE firm, and authorizes \$412,805.10 for Project Contingency, authorizes \$317,859.93 for Capital Administrative Costs, authorizes \$41,000.00 for Materials Testing, authorizes \$2,000.00 for Advertising Expenses; and amending a professional services agreement in an amount not to exceed \$44,000.00 payable to Pape-Dawson Engineers, Inc., for a total ordinance amount of \$6,243,336.03 in connection with the Stahl Road – O'Connor to Judson project, an authorized 2003 General Obligation Street & Pedestrian Improvement Bond funded project, located in Council District 10. Of the \$6,243,336.03 amount, \$1,167,155.00 will be reimbursed by San Antonio Water System (SAWS), and \$130,465.00 will be reimbursed by CPS Energy.

The professional service agreement to be amended with this ordinance was approved by City Council on March 11, 2004 through Ordinance No. 98953 and authorized \$457,500.00 for professional engineering services. This ordinance will increase the total agreement amount to \$501,500.00. This item represents a portion of an estimated project cost of \$6,882,402.00.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This project provides for reconstruction of Stahl Road from O'Connor to Judson to four lanes with a raised median, left turn lanes, 4-foot sidewalks, curbs and associated drainage improvements. The project length is 4,580 linear feet. Construction is anticipated to begin in July 2006 and to be completed by February 2007.

This ordinance also authorizes funding in the amount of \$44,000.00 payable to Pape-Dawson Engineers, Inc. for additional professional engineering services. Additional engineering services are required to revise plans related to separating the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) intersection projects from the bid package. The original scope called for the joint bidding of the MPO O'Connor and Judson intersections in this project.

The lowest responsive bid received exceeded the project budget by \$572,318.03. This additional cost is attributed to the increased cost of asphalt and cement, which are the principal components of this project. The additional cost is being funded from 2006 Certificates of Obligation

This project was advertised for construction bids in the Commercial Recorder, the San Antonio Informer, and La Prensa in April 2006. In addition, the bid announcement was made on TVSA and through the Small Business Economic Development Advocacy (SBEDA) Office. Plans were also available for review by potential bidders at the office of Pape-Dawson Engineers, Inc. located at 555 E. Ramsey, San Antonio, Texas 78216. Bids for this project were opened on May 24, 2006 and four (4) firms responded. Of these, Texas Sterling Construction, L.P. submitted the lowest responsive bid. Texas Sterling Construction, L.P. currently has one active contracts with the City in the amount of \$4,823,445.16. A matrix of the bid outcome is included herein as Attachment 3.

The Economic Development Department is reviewing the list of subcontractors on the Good Faith Effort Plan submitted by Texas Sterling Construction, L.P. and the letter of certification is pending approval. A finalized copy of the Good Faith Effort Plan will be provided at the council meeting.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will be a continuation of City Council policy to complete the development and construction of previously approved 2003 General Obligation Street and Pedestrian Improvement Bonds.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is a one-time capital improvement expenditure in the amount of \$6,243,336.03. Funds in the amount of \$4,373,398.00 are available from the 2003 General Obligation Street & Pedestrian Improvement Bonds. Funds in the amount of \$572,318.03 are available from 2006 Certificates of Obligation. Funds in the amount of \$1,167,155.00 will be reimbursed by SAWS and \$130,465.00 will be reimbursed by CPS Energy.

Budgeted funds for this project, as included in the FY06-11 Capital Improvement Program Budget, total \$4,373,398.00. Funds in the amount of \$572,318.03 are not included in the Capital Budget and are being funded from savings realized in the Semlinger Road – Lord to Rigsby and the Ansley Boulevard Drainage #1091 projects.

Funds are authorized to be appropriated and payable as follows:


