SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

An ordinance amending the Professional Services Agreement with Vickrey & Associates, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$49,064.00, to provide additional engineering and surveying services in connection with the Sky Place Boulevard Re-Alignment Project at the San Antonio International Airport, appropriating funds and revising the budget.

Staff recommends the approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

City Council awared the firm of Vickrey & Associates a Professional Services Contract to provide professional engineering services in connection with two projects, the Sky Place Boulevard Re-Alignment and the Sky Place Boulevard Drainage Project at San Antonio International Airport in October 2003.

These two projects provide a new signalized access for current tenants and future development along Sky Place Boulevard and the construction of an underground drainage system to replace the existing drainage channel along Sky Place Boulevard. The drainage improvements will permit the recapture of approximately 10 acres of property for development. In addition, there is approximately 30 acres of property along Sky Place and Nakoma which combined with the reclaimed property will result in 40 acres of un-leased property suitable for tenant development once platted.

In order to provide suitable building sites for future tenants along Sky Place Boulevard, this area must be re-platted. Vickrey & Associates have presented a proposal in the amount of \$31,584.00 to perform this work.

During the original contract negotiations with Vickrey, it was decided to develop both projects as two separate contracts each with unique contract documents and have both bid, awarded and constructed concurrently. With this concurrent work effort, the consultant's fee during the bid process and construction administration was to have been evenly distributed over the two projects.

Due to acceleration of the street project to accommodate tenant expansion (Sino Swearingen) and tenant relocation (Valero) the fees associated with the two phases of work can not be shared and therefore additional funds in the amount of \$3,654.00 for bidding and \$13,826.00 for construction administration are required.

Members of City staff have reviewed the scope of work and the fees outlined in the proposal and have determined that the fees presented are fair and reasonable.

POLICY ANALYSIS

This action continues the policy of improving facilities at San Antonio International Airport.

FISCAL IMPACT

This action appropriates \$49,064.00 [(\$31,584.00 (platting), \$3,654.00 (bidding), and \$13,826.00 (construction administration)] in the Airport Capital Improvement Fund for engineering and surveying services. Sufficient funds are available for this action.

COORDINATION

This request for ordinance has been coordinated with the following departments: Public Works, Finance, Management & Budget and the City Attorney's Office.
