SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance authorizes the City Manager to accept an amendment to a Cooperative Agreement from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS). It approves the carry-forward of Year One funds in the amount of \$562,260.00 to increase support to the current Year Two, Steps to a Healthier San Antonio program (Steps-SA). The San Antonio Metropolitan Health District (SAMHD) program runs September 22, 2005 through September 21, 2006. In addition, the ordinance adopts the program's revised budget and authorizes amendments to five (5) agreements, which include Bexar County Hospital District dba University Health System (UHS), San Antonio-Bexar County Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), San Antonio Independent School District (SAISD), American Cancer Society (ACS) and YMCA of Greater San Antonio (YMCA).

Staff recommends approval.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The DHHS issued Funding Opportunity No. 04234 in May 2004, entitled "Steps to a Healthier US: A Community-Focused Initiative to Reduce the Burden of Asthma, Diabetes and Obesity." SAMHD assembled interested community-based partners to collaborate on a funding proposal to combat the risk factors of tobacco use, poor nutrition and insufficient physical activity. The new program was named Steps to a Healthier San Antonio (Steps-SA).

In September 2004, the Steps-SA proposal was selected for DHHS funding from more than sixty other urban locations around the United States. Although award notification occurred in September 2004, SAMHD did not receive the Cooperative Agreement Award until December 2004, thereby delaying the City's acceptance of said funds and hiring of staff. The delay resulted in \$562,260.00 of unobligated funds at the end of Year One in September 2005.

In its second year, Steps-SA is continuing its efforts to reduce the community impact of diabetes, obesity and asthma. This ordinance provides additional funding to amend existing Steps-SA agreements with YMCA and SAISD. New departmental agreements will also be executed with several health organizations to expand the Steps-SA program in the SAISD target area.

Along with these new opportunities, Steps-SA will fund internal agreements with Public Works (PW) and Parks and Recreation (PR). PW will survey local government employees to determine how they

commute to work and what barriers there may be to their use of public transportation, cycling or walking. The goal is to reduce air pollution and to increase the physical activity of those surveyed.

PR will identify which parks in the SAISD target area have walking and hiking paths, where placement of mileage markers would encourage people to measure their own level of physical activity.

The majority of the carry-forward dollars (\$300,000) will be used for a community-wide media campaign about the health risks associated with diabetes, obesity and asthma. An existing City contract with Bromley Communications will be used for the information campaign.

The remaining dollars will be used to plan and implement a Built Environment Conference, to fund travel to the Steps US Grantee meeting for Steps-SA partners who submitted abstracts and were invited to present at the CDC Steps US Grantee meeting in Atlanta, Georgia, and to purchase new educational materials for use by Steps-SA office staff.

This ordinance includes amendments to current agreements with the UHS, the MPO and the ACS, allowing for minor changes to be made to line item funds to ensure best usage of available resources.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Passage of the amendments will continue the long-standing practice of utilizing grants and cooperative agreements to support local public health programs of the City.

FISCAL IMPACT

Amendment to the Cooperative Agreement award provides additional funding of \$562,260.00 to the current Year Two award of \$1,508,800.00 to operate the Steps to a Healthier San Antonio initiative for a total of \$2,071,060.00.

COORDINATION

The SAMHD has coordinated with the City Attorney's Office, Office of Management and Budget, Finance Department, Contract Services, Department of Public Works and Department of Parks and Recreation.
