SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This ordinance will amend the current license agreement at the Parks Facility Headquarters/City Nursery Property in City Council District 6 between the City of San Antonio and the Miracle League of San Antonio to add approximately 1.5 acres of City owned property at Wolff Baseball Stadium for the Miracle League's use in developing parking for its facilities.

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Athletic organizations request to develop and utilize City property through long-term license arrangements in order to provide practice and game fields for their league play. In exchange, the organizations provide venues for youth sports and maintain the specified park areas at their expense.

The Miracle League of San Antonio entered into a license agreement with the City of San Antonio for use of 3.67 acres of City owned property for the purpose of developing and maintaining all weather surface football, soccer, and track fields for use by individuals with physical disabilities. The term of the Miracle League license agreement is for 10 years, September 1, 2005 through August 31, 2015. The Miracle League is responsible for maintenance of the licensed premises during the term of the agreement.

The Miracle League has recently requested use of an additional approximately 1.5 acres of Wolff Baseball Stadium property adjacent to their license fields for parking for their participants. The Miracle League will pave the 1.5 acres at its own expense. Additionally, the Miracle League will coordinate all events scheduled at their licensed premises with the Missions Baseball Group and with Alamodome staff. All other license agreement terms as executed in 2005 remain the same.

POLICY ANALYSIS

This action follows the long standing City policy of providing access to public parks for athletic organizations as a means of providing recreation programs for youth in San Antonio.

FISCAL IMPACT

The General Fund budget is not impacted.

COORDINATION


This action has been coordinated with the City Attorney's Office and the Alamodome Department.



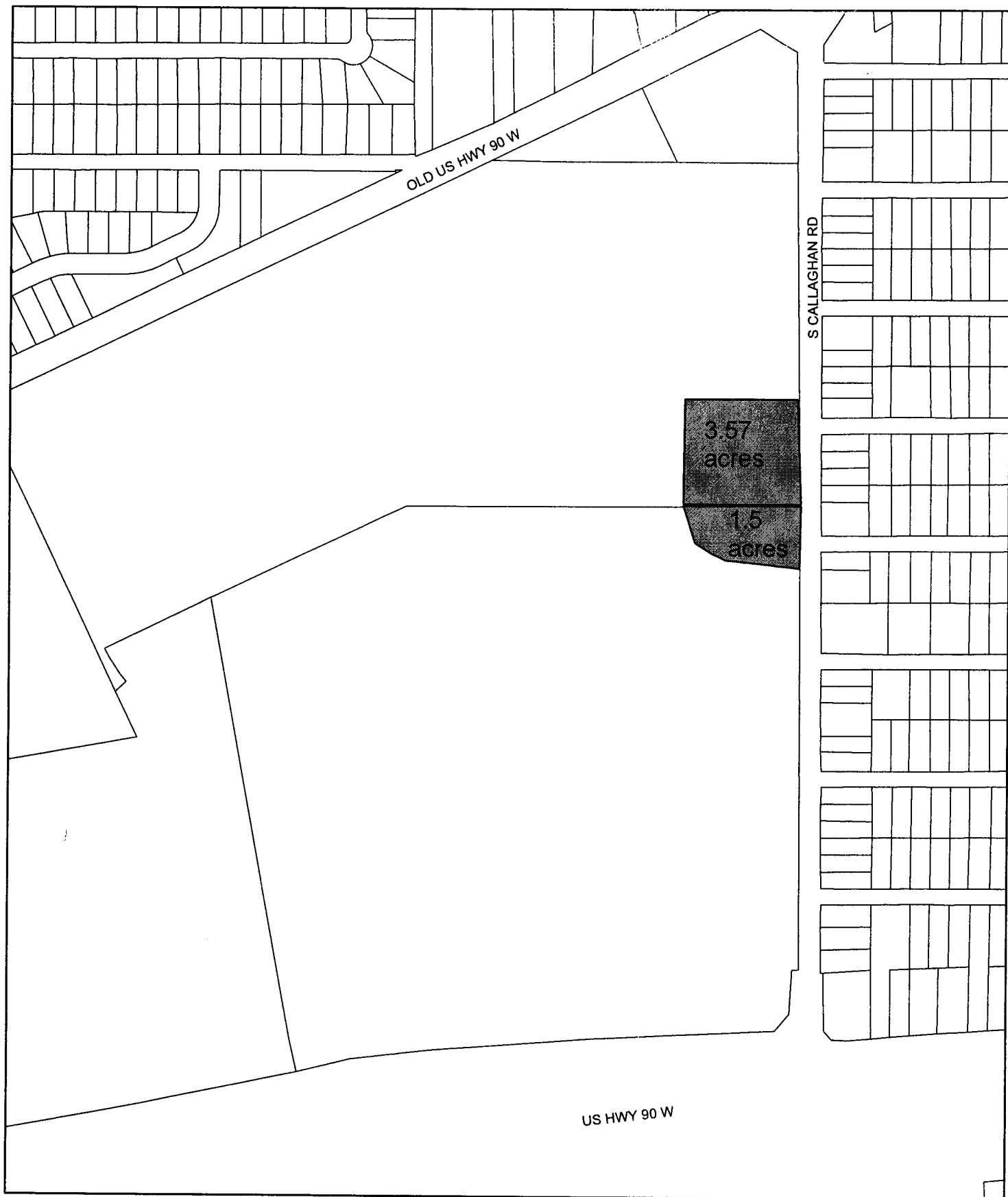
